R	RudraVeena	A large plucked string instrument used in HindustaniClassical music.	
S	Sushir	Aero phones, wind instruments in which sound is produced by the vibration of air.	
	Sitar	A plucked string instrument used in HindustaniClassical music.	
	Sarod	A stringed musical instrument used in HindustaniClassical music.	
	Santoor	A trapezoid shaped string musical instrument played with two wooden sticks.	
	Sarangi	A bowing stringed instrument used in HindustaniClassical music.	
	Shehnai	A wind instrument particularly played on auspicious occasions like weddings.	
Т	Tata	Chordophones or stringed instruments.	
	Tanpura	A plucked string instrument used for providing the basic note to the singer and instrument player.	
	Tabla	The percussion instrument consisting of a pair of drums.	
	Tumba	The stomach of stringed instruments, gourd.	
V	Vadya	Instrument.	
	Violin	A string instrument usually with four strings.
