East India Company issued 3 types of Coinages for its		
three Presidencies of Bombay, Madras and Bengal.		
Bombay Presidency was the first to issue English style		
coinage from the Bombay Mint in 1672 with silver coins		
called Anglinas, copper coins called Copperoons and tin		
coins called Tinnys. Bombay Mint also issued Persian		
style coins in the name of English Kings, James II and		
William III (and Queen Mary)		
Madras Presidency issued coinage based on the		
Vijayanagara paradigm of gold pagodas especially on the		
late Vijayanagara coinage issued from Chandragiri with		
images of Lord Venkateshwara and his two wives. The		
pagoda known as the Three Swami pagoda soon evolved		
into the Star Pagoda with a reverse 5-point star issued by		
the Madras Presidency.		
Bengal Presidency was the last Presidency to issue its own		
coinage when the EIC defeated the Nawab of Bengal in		
1757 and issued a Mughal style rupee coin with the mint		
name AlinagarKalkata and later Kalkata. However, the		
rupee of Murshidabad became established as the Sicca		
Rupee of Bengal Presidency especially when the EIC took		
over the Diwani of Bengal from Emperor Shah Alam II in		
1765.
